ESSER III Overview

WATER VALLEY ISD is allocated \$683,613.00 in funding to use through September 2024. At least 20% of those funds must be used to address learning loss.







Allocation: \$683K

- 2/3 (\$455k) now
- 1/3 (\$227K) when U.S.
 Dept of Ed approves
 TEA plan
- One-time funds

Timeline: 3/13/20 - 9/30/24

- Supplanting allowed with restrictions
- Application due July 27, after period of public comment

- Use: 20%+ on Learning Loss
- Evidence-based interventions (extended day/year, summer learning)
- Address academic + social-emotional impact of pandemic on specific populations

ESSER III Requirements

To receive its ESSER allotment, WVISD must have two written plans along with evidence of meaningful community engagement.

1. Written Plans

- Use of Funds Plan
- Safe Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Services Plan Both plans will be posted on WVISD website

2. Community Consultation

- Meaningful input from a wide variety of stakeholders
- Conducting via meetings, surveys, and teacher engagement

ESSER III Allowable Activities

Below are examples of the types of interventions and supports ESSER money can

Academic Supports

- Summer learning, after-school, and online learning
- Assessments and curricular materials
- Educational technology
- Support for student groups disproportionately impacted by Covid

Social-Emotional Supports

- Mental health services
- Family engagement

Health/Safety

- Campus preparedness to mitigate Covid spread (PPE, ventilation)
- Coordination with other agencies to prevent and respond to Covid-19

Continuity of Services

Maintain district services, including continuing to employ existing staff



WVISD Planning Process (1 of 2)

WVISD is convened a cross-functional working group to create a plan that linked to guiding principles, aligned to impact, and guided by stakeholder input.

Working Group

- Provide input and review of initial application
- Hold regular meetings through entire grant period
- Members include:
- Business: Purchasing, Facilities, Human Resources, Tech Services
- Instruction: Curriculum, Counseling, CTE, School Improvement, SpEd, Federal Programs, Instructional Tech, FACE
- Public Relations: Parents, Community Members, Business Representitives

Stakeholder Input

- Surveys (e.g. recent Spring '21 Community Survey)
- Meetings with key community members, organizations, and representatives
- Website for ongoing transparency and additional community input
- Separate working group/observation process to identify best practices and innovative ideas directly from AISD teachers

















Resolution of the Board Regarding ESSER III and Policy CB(LOCAL), State and Federal Revenue Sources

WHEREAS, on April 28, 2021, TEA notified school districts of the opportunity to apply for their allocation of the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief III (ESSER III) Fund, which should be used to respond to the pandemic and to address student learning loss as a result of COVID-19:

WHEREAS, TEA published guidance regarding how these funds can be used and local compliance requirements school districts must follow, including a recommendation that districts develop local board policy to address how the district will provide the required public notice regarding federal grants and awards for consistency;

WHEREAS, Texas Education Code 11.151 gives the Board of Trustees the exclusive power and duty to govern and oversee the management of the public schools of the District; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that a need exists to adjust local policy provisions to address public notice for federal grants and awards and approval of required grant plans;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Water Valley ISD School District adopts the following text for inclusion at CB(LOCAL), State and Federal Revenue Sources:

- The District shall provide public notice of federal grant applications through an
 information item at a Board meeting and by publishing information on the District's
 website. The District shall make available opportunities for public input as required by
 law or the granting agency.
- Approval of required grant and award plans shall be by the Superintendent.

The change to CB(LOCAL) is effective based on the adoption date of this resolution.
